PROPOSED GRANT OF GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE SHARES AND TO ISSUE NEW SHARES AND PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS AND NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for (i) the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors; (ii) the grant of the Issue Mandate to the Directors

and the extension of the Issue Mandate by adding to it the aggregate nominal amount of Shares repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate; and (iii) the re-election of the retiring Directors.

2. PROPOSED GRANT OF THE REPURCHASE AND ISSUE MANDATES

The general mandates previously granted to the Directors to repurchase and issue Shares by the Shareholders at the annual general meeting of the Company held on 20 May 2011 will expire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. In order to give the Company the flexibility to repurchase and issue Shares if and when appropriate, the following ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the grant of new general mandates to the Directors:

- (a) to purchase Shares on the Stock Exchange of an aggregate nominal amount of up to 10% of the total nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company on the date of passing such resolution (i.e. an aggregate nominal amount of Shares up to HK\$476,235 (equivalent to 47,623,526 Shares) assuming that the total number of Shares in issue remains the same at 476,235,256 Shares from the Latest Practicable Date up to the date of passing such resolution (the "Repurchase Mandate");
- (b) to allot, issue or deal with Shares of an aggregate nominal amount of up to 20% of the total nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue on the date of passing such resolution (i.e. an aggregate nominal amount of Shares up to HK\$952,471 (equivalent to 95,247,051 Shares) assuming that the total number of Shares in issue remains the same at 476,235,256 Shares from the Latest Practicable Date up to the date of passing such resolution (the "Issue Mandate"); and
- (c) to extend the Issue Mandate by an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to and in accordance with the Repurchase Mandate.

The Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company held after the Annual General Meeting or any earlier date as referred to in the proposed ordinary resolutions contained in items 4 and 5 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting as set out on pages 17 to 20 of this circular. With reference to the Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares or issue any Shares pursuant thereto.

In accordance with the requirements of the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the grant of the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement for such purpose is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Article 86(3) of the Articles of Association, the Board shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy of the Board or as an addition to the existing Board. Any Director appointed by the Board to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting of the Company after his /her appointment and any Director appointed by the Board as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company after his/her appointment, and shall then be eligible for re-election at that meeting.

According to Article 86(3) of the Articles of Association, Mr. Lu Bin ("Mr. Lu"), who has been appointed as an executive Director on 19 August 2011, and Ms. Wu Shihong, who has been appointed as an Independent non-executive Director on 27 March 2012, shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. Mr. Lu and Ms. Wu, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the same meeting.

In addition, pursuant to Article 87(1) of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting, one third of the Directors shall also retire from office by rotation and be eligible for re-election. Article 87(2) of the Articles of Association also states that any Director appointed by the Board pursuant to Article 86(3) of the Articles of Association shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Director or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation.

As such, as at the Latest Practicable Date, there are five Directors on the Board (among them Mr. Chan Yiukwong has retired and offered himself for re-election at last annual general meeting). Accordingly, two Directors shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. Mr. Liu Xiaosong and Mr. Zeng Liqing are willing to retire at the Annual General Meeting and both of them, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the same meeting.

Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, a listed issuer shall disclose the details required under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules of any director(s) proposed to be re-elected or proposed new director(s) in the notice or accompanying circular to its shareholders of the relevant general meeting, if such re-election or appointment is subject to shareholders' approval at that relevant general meeting. The requisite details of the retiring Directors are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

4. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

The notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out on pages 17 to 20 of this circular. At the Annual General Meeting, resolutions will be proposed to approve, inter alia, the grant of the Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate, the extension of the Issue Mandate by the addition thereto of the nominal amount of Shares repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate and the re-election of the retiring Directors.

Pursuant to the amendments to the Listing Rules, which came into force on 1 January 2009, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Accordingly, all the proposed resolutions will be put to vote by way of poll at the Annual General Meeting. An announcement on the poll vote results will be made by the Company after the Annual General Meeting in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

A form of proxy for use at the Annual General Meeting is enclosed with this circular and such form of proxy is also published on the respective websites of Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited (http://www.hkexnews.hk) and the Company (http:// www.a8.com). To be valid, the form of proxy must be completed and signed in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and deposited, together with the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a certified copy of that power of attorney or authority at the Share Registrar of the Company in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong, not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the Annual General Meeting or any adjournment thereof. 5. **RECOMMENDATION**

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the grant of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. REASONS FOR REPURCHASE OF SHARES

The Directors believe that the grant of the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders.

Repurchases of Shares may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, result in an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share. The Directors are seeking the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to give the Company the flexibility to do so if and when appropriate. The number of Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are repurchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time, having regard to the circumstances then pertaining.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 476,235,256 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution set out in item 4 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting in respect of the grant of the Repurchase Mandate and assuming that the total number of Shares in issue remains the same at 476,235,256 Shares from the Latest Practicable Date up to the date of passing such resolution, the Directors would be authorized under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Repurchase Mandate remains in force, an aggregate nominal amount of the Shares up to HK\$476,235 (equivalent to 47,623,526 Shares), representing 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares in issue as at the date of the Annual General Meeting.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association, the laws of the Cayman Islands and/or any other applicable laws, as the case may be.

4. IMPACT OF REPURCHASES

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2011) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

5. TAKEOVERS CODE

If a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases when the Company exercises its powers to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 or Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Liu and his associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) together held 186,667,954 Shares, representing approximately 39.20% of the issued share capital of the Company. Accordingly, Mr. Liu may be required to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code if, as a result of the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate by the Directors, the aggregate shareholding of Mr. Liu and his associates in the Company is increased by more than 2% in any 12 month period.

In the event that the Directors exercise the Repurchase Mandate in full to repurchase Shares, the aggregate shareholding of Mr. Liu and his associates in the Company would increase from approximately 39.20% to approximately 43.55% and therefore Mr. Liu would be required to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. However, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent.

6. GENERAL

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge after having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the grant of the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the grant of the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

(Nasdaq: Dell) and China International Trust and Investment Corporation (currently known as CITIC Group). Mr. Lu has over 18 years' experience in strategic planning of corporate finance, finance management, equity investment, etc., and over 10 years' diversified working experience and in-depth understanding in the telecommunication and internet industries. Mr. Lu jointed the Company in February 2011 as Chief Financial Officer and was appointed as an executive director on 19 August 2011.

In 1987, Mr. Liu graduated from China Electric Power Research Institute in the PRC with a Master's degree in Engineering. In 1991, he studied at Tsinghua University as a PhD research student. He has diversified experience in the technology, media and telecommunications industry. He is one of the co-founders of Tencent Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (Stock Code: 00700.HK). In 2004, Mr. Liu was admitted to the Shenzhen Experts Working Union. Mr. Liu was appointed as the Vice President of the Copyright Union of the Internet Society of China and the Copyright Society of China in August 2007 and September 2007 respectively. He is also the Vice President of the Shenzhen Hi-tech Association. He is the founder of the Group and was appointed as a Director on 2 October 2007. Mr. Liu is currently responsible for the overall strategic planning and the whole business operation and management of the Group.
